Love for Lane County has been walking alongside a client for several months now. She first came to us needing household items and furniture for a new-to-her apartment that she was going to share with her adult son who needs additional support. We lost contact with her before we could deliver the household items she requested because her phone was stolen. We started the process again and scheduled a time for her to come in and pickup the requested household items. When she arrived at our office, it was obvious that she was having a difficult day. Her family dynamic had resulted in her needing to move again and the new apartment had some maintenance issues that were taking too long to resolve. She had an altercation with her son that morning. She shared that she is the primary caregiver for a parent battling a terminal illness. She felt overwhelmed and alone.

“What do you need?” “I need a group of women.” This client needed someone to invite her into a place of healing, encouragement and support. What better place than a family of believers? Because she doesn't have transportation of her own, finding that church within walking distance was important.

God is so good! One of our volunteers attends a church in her neighborhood and was able to connect with her and extend a personal invitation to come to the next Sunday service.

### Love for Lane County - Looking Back, and Looking Forward

Dear Friends of Love for Lane County,

As 2025 comes to an end, we have both much to be grateful for and to look forward to. Here are some of the highlights -

**Looking Back** - During this past year two new staff joined LFLC. I, Derek Isaksen, came on board in March of this year as the Executive Director and Jennifer Chalmers was hired as our Clearinghouse Coordinator. Many positive changes have been made to our operations, communications, church relations, and, most significantly, our client care. One key change was how we serve those in life transitions with the need of furniture. In the past we would collect, repair, warehouse, and deliver furniture to our clientele. Rather than our clients having to accept whatever items we had collected, this year we forged a new partnership with St. Vincent de Paul that affords our clients the dignity to take a voucher to their stores and "shop" for what furniture suits their tastes and needs!

From December 2024 through November 2025, LFLC has been able to meet 430 needs which served 865 adults and 397 children. To accomplish this, 3,197 volunteer hours were logged. This represents not only the 1,262 lives touched through the mercy of God's servants, but meaningful connections established with prayer. Often our clients will have up to four touchpoints of conversations and prayer throughout the course of our volunteers rendering services. The Good News is being spread one conversation and prayer at a time!

**Looking Forward** - Looking forward to 2026, many more changes will be coming to LFLC. Where in the past so much of what we accomplished was "transactional," we have begun to make efforts to be more "relational" and "transformational" - "Not just a handout, but a hand up". What this practically means is that we are working on intentional connections beyond the initial need being met. Rather than walking the short path with our clients, we are taking the long road to understand more deeply how to help them. Our goal is to mobilize and resource churches to serve their neighbors by focusing on these Four Pillars - *Righteous Acts of Mercy, Redemptive Relationships, a Robust Delivery Eco-System, and Regenerative Training Pathways*. As 2026 unfolds, we will be sharing more of this strategy with you, our supporters.

Thank you to those of you who have lifted our ministry up in prayer, spread the news about LFLC, volunteered, given beds, furniture, and tangible goods, and have given financially to support the work of LFLC in 2025. These expressions of love are making a HUGE difference in our clients' lives. As you consider your **Year-End Giving**, we ask you to remember LFLC in your generosity. Your financial partnership with us will help to ensure our ability to reach the goals God has given LFLC in 2026 and beyond!
